A word from Rev. Barry Andrews, Senior Pastor

You've heard folks say that Florida really does not have four seasons. That may be true for the uninformed, but, for those of us in the know, we can easily identify four seasons, and maybe more.

As an example, this time of year might be called winter by some, but we know it as snow-bird season. Even this far north, we're blessed with our friends from the frozen north, for a season, while they work around Jacksonville as NOMADS. More than workers, though, they have become our friends, brothers and sisters in Christ. We count it a joy when we see familiar faces, and look forward to meeting new friends as the season unfolds.



We're soon to meet a new friend, sent to us from the Young Adult Ministries (YAM) department of the Florida Annual Conference. We've accepted YAM's recommendation to us of Camille Feaster, who will serve as a youth worker intern here at Faith. She has experience working with youth and in recreation, and is excited about coming to Jacksonville. Indeed, we're looking forward to a new season of UMYF, distinct from other pleasing and productive seasons past.

We're also moving out of 2016, and we reflect on this season of the church's life. We've stabilized, and balanced expenses and income, a several-year goal. Rentals have increased, and tithes and offerings still are the major part of the receipts of the church. I often point out to my preacher buddies that this church does an extraordinary job of tithing, and I'm proud of those who give to the Lord. Church is about more than money, however, and we're also very challenged by the several-decades old decline in worship attendance. We're really good at being welcoming, once folks come in, but we need to polish our invitational skills. A major transition has been the decrease in the paid staff, including secretary and youth director, with the voids being ably filled by willing volunteers. Again, my preacher buddies have, more than once, by observation and reporting, noted the high level of volunteerism at Faith. May I note how well the office has run, and how very proud I am of the youth for sticking together, and running the UMYF with programs, prayers, and recreation, during this season?

In the new year we look for an increase in activity; it's an indicator of increased devotion, and, hopefully, new persons involved, becoming Christians. There are voids in our ministry that need to be filled, and areas of ministry that are yet to be revealed to us. In this new season of the church's life you are invited to take a part, in worship, study, & service. Let's grow together, as disciples and friends, as we become the seasoning for the world, for Christ and His Church.

Obituary

Well, Andy Sabol has gone home. He left on December 3, 2016, and is now probably telling his stories to a whole new audience. Andrew E. Sabol was born in Sewickley, Pennsylvania on June 6, 1930 to parents, Andrew S. Sabol and Florence A. Sabol. He met and married the love of his life, Joan (Faver) at West Liberty State College in West Virginia in 1955. An active volunteer, he served on the Board of the Campfire Girls, President and founder of the St. Mark's Episcopal Day School Dad's Club, over 20 years as a board member, including two terms as president of the American Society for Training & Development, President of the Florida Municipal Electric Association Training Committee, and Vice President of the Northeast Florida Safety Association. Andy was a Dale Carnegie Course Instructor and Instructor-Trainer for over 20 years in the Tampa and north Florida area. Retired from the JEA as Division Manager of Training & Safety in 1992, he spent most of his retirement as a volunteer with the Boy Scouts. He has been a member of the BSA since 1941. He started and hosted a weekly TV show for the Boy Scouts for over six years, was a contributor to the Scouting Newsletter, authored five books about Scouting, produced three sets of CD's covering his Boy Scout experiences, wrote articles for the Florida Wildlife magazine, wrote articles for the Retired City Employee newsletter and served on the North Florida Council Executive Board of the Boy Scouts since 1989. "A" is an Eagle Scout, was awarded the Silver Beaver, District Award of Merit, Outstanding Eagle Scout Award, the National Leadership Award, the Silver Axe and the Silver Fox Awards from the North Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America. He was awarded the Vigil Honor from the Order of the Arrow, BSA. Andy was a true "Sportsman". He loved to hunt & fish. But he rarely shot or caught anything. He said he was a "Carrier-of the-Sabol Sportsman Curse!"

Andy is survived by his wife, Joanie; son, Mark Sabol (Deborah); daughter, Trish Kramer (Billy Kramer); granddaughter, Jordan; and grandsons, Will (Kenzie), Clay (Zara) and Drew. *Please keep Andy's family and friends in your prayers!*


