



It's been a fast start to the new year. Perhaps you'd be interested to know some of what goes on around the church.

Sundays there are 4 different language worship services— English at 10:30, Spanish at noon, Kachin in Wesley Hall at 6:30, and Zomi in the church at 7:00. The English and Kachin are most alike in traditional liturgies; the Spanish have contemporary music, with liturgical elements, and the Zomi are mostly non-liturgical, but with some familiar elements, though. The English and Spanish are Methodist, of course, and the Kachin and Zomi are types of liberal Baptist, with roots in the American Baptist Church, and

connections still with that denomination and the Southern Baptists. (Like the Methodists, the Baptists split before the Civil War, unlike the Methodists, they never reunited.) There are also Sunday School classes—English, Spanish, and Zomi, Children's nursery—English, Kachin, and Zomi, words on the screen, guitars in the Kachin and Zomi, piano in the English and Kachin, and recorded music in the Spanish and Zomi. Only the English have a formal choir, but the Spanish, Kachin, and Zomi all have solos, duets, trios, etc. every week. The Spanish have an after church meal most every Sunday, the English and Kachin occasionally, and the Zomi almost never.

There was one Zomi and one Kachin memorial service this month, which is not that uncommon. In spite of congregations that are enviably made up of mostly young men and young families, they suffer a high mortality rate, partly because of the physical torture many endured in Burma, and the hardships of the refugee camps in Indonesia. They also will memorialize here the death of well-known family and public figures in Burma, often killed by their oppressors.

Sunday does not just happen, of course. The choir practices every Wednesday, and before church, for the offertory, the worship committee prepares the church, Fermin cleans, I pick the content and Marcia prepares and prints the weekly bulletin, and, most Sundays, I prepare an easy-to-remember sermon. Multiply parts and pieces of this by 4, and you have an idea of the scope of preparation necessary for what came seem like a few, brief hours on Sunday. Will you be warm? Part of that is Glenn arranging for fuel for the boiler. Will you be cool? It's because the AC gets serviced twice a year. Dry? New roof a few years back. Bulletin on the screen? Up until the last few weeks, Mark has prepared and ran this, most every Sunday, for 10 years. Thomas is preparing it, while Mark still runs it. Sunday School lesson? Teachers have prepared. Goodies for café fellowship? Seems to be mostly Donna, Susan, or Susan. I start the coffee pot.

Thomas has kept the youth busy, and it is the rare week that several are not around during the week, or school holidays, cleaning up, practicing in their band, or just hanging out. He's inquired about porch furniture, to enhance the hanging out portion, if you have any to spare. There are also UMYF meetings, which are high-energy and loud events, which attracts youth and connects them to God and his church. As this is written we're waiting on the retreat weekend, Thomas has made two trips over to the Sulzbacher Center in preparation for the service day, the bunk rooms have been cleaned and readied, and volunteers are getting meals lined up. From collecting firewood for a campfire to grocery shopping, we'll be ready.

Obviously, there's quite a lot more to cover— there's always next month. I hope you see the point here—this is an active, vital, busy church, with many opportunities for service-worship, planning, preparation, engagement, you name it. Sure, we can't do everything, but we can be true to the mission God has for us, and do that service well. Take a part this year—there will be more details forthcoming, but, most especially, make your service to God an act of personal and community worship, first on Sunday morning, and then throughout the week, as we all work together for the good of Christ's Body, the Church.



What a roller coaster ride of weather we've had lately! From rainy days to bright sunshine to freezing temps, we've had it all. A special thanks to Wells Fargo and HandsOn Jacksonville who chose our Emergency Services Center as a work site for the annual MLK Day of Service. Over 20 volunteers braved the cold and came out to complete projects all around the grounds.

Our food pantry is in need of several items this week, including canned fruit, pasta sauce, cereal, mixed vegetables, juice boxes, granola bars, and jelly. Travel sized hygiene items such as deodorant, razors, toothpaste, and tooth brushes are also needed.

Our Meals on Wheels program is growing. Currently, we're delivering between 43 and 48 meals each day to homebound Senior citizens in our community. It takes about 2 hours to deliver meals and each volunteer only delivers once or twice each month. Our CNA Scholarship Program is currently accepting applications for 2016. In 2015, we awarded 17 scholarships to qualified candidates in our community.
