A word from Rev. Barry Andrews, Senior Pastor

Sorry, we're a little late getting the newsletter out (We missed June entirely). Unlike Sundays, which come with great regularity (every 7 days!), and present an immutable deadline, if the newsletter is a little late, well...

We were busy the last week of May, most specifically as hosts of the Northeast District Committee on Ordained Ministry, where I serve as part of the theology team (We call committees teams nowadays, to make us think, what? That it's more fun? Hmm.) Our job, as a committee of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry, is to work with ministerial candidates, licensed local pastors, and those making application for provisional deacon or elder (I'm an elder, who was first a candidate, then student local pastor, full- time local pastor, deacon with probationary membership, and now elder in full connection. The names



of the categories have changed over the years, but the basic system is the same.). In the DCOM we have four teams: personal growth, leadership, proclamation, and theology. We meet several times a year; May or June, August, maybe September, December, maybe January, and February. At this meeting we were interviewing 4 first-time candidates and 3 making application for part-time local pastor.

We met Wednesday and Thursday, with about 20 committee members in attendance. Faith provided a place to meet and hospitality: sort of a café fellowship breakfast, and a full lunch. We've met at other churches before, and at the district office, but are always challenged by hot, or cold rooms, locked doors, and a general lack of hospitality. We've earned a reputation in the district for hospitality, and I would say, without a touch of modesty, that we delivered. Our guests are impressed with friendliness, good food, and real dishes. We represented ourselves well, by serving others.

May I also say you made me look good in the eyes of my colleagues, and I'm very grateful for that. May I also say that we work best when we work together. That is, I look good when you look good, and you look good when I look good. It's more than mutuality; it is the gift of goodness and grace. Rather than being in competition for the glory, we're trying our best to give God the glory, and that, in this context, is called hospitality.

Think about that this summer when new folks come to church. We should think of them as guests, not just visitors, and treat them as neighbors, not strangers. Even if they don't come back, we've represented God's church well, and that serves the Kingdom well. It's a lonely, disconnected world out there. Offer our guests the chance to feel welcome, to be at home, and offer them God's love through His gracious hospitality.

From our Missions Chairperson, Donna Glasner: An UMVIM (United Methodist Volunteers In Mission) team from Hyde Park UMC in Tampa visited our Sister Church, Martin Perez, as part of their trip to Havana in June. I am posting the full email we received following their trip in Wesley Hall and here are excerpts of the email:

"We had so many blessings from this church. The first came with the Sunday sermon by a young 9 year old girl named Sarai. She, her mother, and her brother miss her father who is in Dallas TX paving the way to a better life in the states.

Our team did a children's program with about 20 children of the church (and the adults participated too!). Everyone had a great time, with music, paints, coloring sheets, musical instruments (from Oriental Trading), and a short bible story drama on The Lost Sheep, that the kids and adults participated in. We ended with tootsie rolls for all.

We weren't able to do construction because of rain, so about 6 of us went back to Martin Perez on Tuesday and met with the pastor, pastora, and all the wonderful dedicated and creative children's Sunday School teachers. We:

- Left many Sunday School resources and VBS curriculum for them,
- Taught the teachers and some of the older kids how to lead a children's bell choir,
- Taught them to use felt boards (When someone is going to Havana, we will send felt supplies to them).
- Bought and gave them some children's music CD's, and
- Left a suitcase of donations, including about 15 pair of athletic shoes. We were unable to find a laptop and phones, but perhaps this is something your church can work on for them.

We just loved the people in the church. They all have such a great spirit and there is a small group of ladies in the church who have been members for 60+ years...they were wonderful to talk with. It was interesting to learn about the church during the aftermath of the revolution. You have an amazing sister church. We will continue to pray for them. As soon as I get all the pictures together I will send them to you. God's blessings,
